from New Zealand, has created a Peace Garden for the Tibetan society at the Historical Museum in London. His work consists of slate and stone of the region and suggests movement and rest, water and land, yin and yang, and refers to the rivers of the city and the warrior memorial "Steinchen" (Kurpark).

### 9 Tae Mori



is an artistic and functional design of the street in the center of the town. To enable identification with the artwork citizens and young people of the city were included with the planning and realization of this work. 279 salmons engraved in the cobbles remind of the origin of the name of the city (historic center).

# Sculptures walk

Funded by the state competition North Rhine Westphalia "Ab in die Mitte" in the years 2000 and 2012 nationally and internationally renowned artists had been invited to two sculpture symposia whose works are related to existing sculptures and the historic citysight at the time and can be visited during the Sculpture walk - a highlight for the art-loving visitors to the city.

### 1 Johannes Löffelmann

from Toeging am Inn created five columns after Kneipp's Theory. The Column of inner harmony, of water and of movement (Wilhelmsplatz), healthy diet and medicinal herbs (herb garden).

# Ludger Krause-Sparmann und Jan-Willem Beeren (Künstlergruppe: beispielhaft.com)

from Alfter / Bonn constructed from 3.500 battens, 35.000 screws and 3,5m³ of concrete the mushroom forest. After a devastating hurricane, he was re-erected with the assistance of citizens of the city in a smaller format (City Garden).

# 3 Wolfgang Kreutter

one of the most famous regional sculptors, created the bronze sculpture, "The young couple", in 1981. It is a gift from the Sparkasse Wittgenstein (City Garden).

## 4 Johannes Dröge

1981 awarded the State Prize for Sculpture North Rhine Westphalia. His two-part stone sculpture comments on the sculpture by Wolfgang Kreutter "The young couple". With his work, Johannes Dröge wants to express the giving and receiving, without which a dual relationship cannot work (City Garden).

#### 5 Franz Stähler

awarded the gold medal of the Int. Ceramic competition Faenza, Italy, Franz Stahler is a hochrenommierter ceramist. His sculpture was destroyed in 2008 due to vandalism. Today, a bronze plaque commemorates the work of bricks that came from the former brickworks of Bad Laasphe (Former clay pit Kurpark).
